

ACT Math: Content & Pacing

Content:

- 60 questions in 60 minutes
- Content breakdown
 - 23% Pre-Algebra
 - 17% Elementary Algebra
 - 15% Intermediate Algebra
 - 15% Coordinate Geometry
 - 23% Plane Geometry
 - 7% Trigonometry

Pacing Concerns:

- Average 1 minute per question*
- Difficulty escalates steadily throughout
- Problems at the end are much harder but worth same points
- Rushing and cherry-picking can be dangerous

ACT Math: Difficulty Distribution




Data reflects performance of several thousand first-time ACT takers on eleven different tests.




Subject Test Policies

- Cannot take SAT and Subject Tests on same date
- ▲ 1 hour per test (up to 3 in one day)
- ▲ "Guessing Penalty" is still in effect
- ▲ 200-800 scale
- "Softer" scale but "Tougher" testing pool

What's a Good Subject Test Score?



Math Level 2 Subject Test




Testing Timelines



What is ACT Section Re-testing?

First, the Answers . . .

- Starts September 2020
- Students may re-take sections of their choosing (one or multiple)
- Paper version must be taken first, full test
- Section re-take only available via computer-based format

But There Are Still Questions . . .

- Which colleges will accept single-section scores?
- Which test centers will offer computer-based testing?
- Is it a smart test taking strategy anyway?

Guidance for students

- CLASS OF 2021
 - Available senior fall, but...
 - YOU MUST BE COMFORTABLE WTH DIGITAL TESTING
 - UNCERTAIN AVAILABILITY: TEST SITES AND COMPUTERS
 - STILL WAITING ON FEEDBACK FROM COLLEGES
- CLASS OF 2022+
 - Watch how colleges react; wait for initial administrations
 - Anticipate limited availability
 - If embraced unilaterally, net effect of section re-testing may be negligible
